


जनता की सरकार जयराम संस्कार



हिमाचल भारत का ऐसा राज्य है, जहां बिजली उत्पादन राज्य के खर्च की सीमा से ज्यादा है। राज्य के हर गांव में बहुत पहले ही बिजली पहुंच चुकी थी। जयराम सरकार की उपलब्धि यह है कि वह लगातार हर गांव में नल से जल पहुंचाने की दिशा में जुटी हुई है। हिमाचल अपनी विकास यात्रा की वजह से दूसरे पहाड़ी राज्यों के लिए प्रतिमान बनकर उभरा है। हिमाचल प्रदेश के इतिहास में 7.63 लाख नल कनेक्शन लगे थे। उधर, जल जीवन मिशन के तहत बीते ढाई साल में ही हिमाचल प्रदेश में 8.35 लाख नए घरेलू नल कनेक्शन लगाए गए हैं। 1971 में जब राज्य पंजाब से अलग हुआ, तब यहां प्रति व्यक्ति आय 651 रुपये सालाना थी, जो अब बढ़कर दो लाख एक हजार 854 रुपए हो गई है। यह आंकड़ा राष्ट्रीय प्रति व्यक्ति आय 51 हजार 528 रुपये से अधिक है। निश्चित तौर पर इसमें जयराम ठाकुर सरकार की भी बड़ी भूमिका है। पचास साल पहले हिमाचल प्रदेश जब गठित हुआ था, तब यहां सिर्फ 10 जिले थे।
